

What is Advent & How to Celebrate

Advent derives from the Latin word "adventus" which means arrival or coming. We are preparing to celebrate the birth of Jesus, but also preparing for His return!

There are typically four themes, one for each week leading up to Advent: hope, love, joy, peace

There is not an "official" order for these, so you might see them in different order in different Advent plans.

Often, people set up an Advent wreath or Advent log with candles for each of the 4 weeks leading up to Christmas. The last candle is lit on Christmas Day: the Christ candle.

Advent begins the fourth Sunday before Christmas. It is a part of the church calendar. It is essentially the "new year" of the church. The candles are lit each Sunday evening leading up to Christmas.

How to make a capsule crafty supply stash

Do you feel overwhelmed by your crafty supply stash? Do you have stickers, washi tape, and journals coming out your ears so you have no clue where to begin when you want to sit down and get creative?

Then, I have the solution for you!

You have probably heard of a capsule wardrobe before. Instead of having your whole closet to pick from, you narrow it down to a few select pieces that work well together interchangeably. I like to do this same thing with my craft supplies.





First, take a few minutes to look around your crafty space. Perhaps you have a desk in the corner of your living room. Or maybe you have a whole office space. Think about what craft supplies you reach for over and over again. What are your favorites?

Think about what projects you are going to work on for the season. Pull coordinating supplies to use to go along with those projects. I try to stick to 1-3 projects a month, so I don't get overwhelmed.

Gather those supplies in a container and try to only reach for those during the season!

What are your favorite supplies? What do you reach for again & again? Make those easy to grab and use!

Ways to house your capsule crafty supply stash:

- Basket
- Gardening tote (get my favorite one <u>HERE</u> on Amazon)
- Rolling cart
- Cardboard box
- Plastic bin from the Dollar Tree

What to include in your capsule crafty supply:

- Printables from the Creative Faith Etsy shop, printed and cut out on white or clear sticker paper
- Tiny scissors
- Pens
- Highlighters
- Stickers
- Washi tape
- Watercolor tin with brush
- Gelato crayons
- Die cuts with a tape runner or glue pen

How to Make Washi Tape Shapes

Do you have an access of washi tape in your crafty supply stash? Washi tape is one of my favorite supplies to use. In the summer of 2017 I created my first ever washi tape shape (the pineapple image featured on the next page). Since then, I have made lots of other fun shapes. This is especially easy to do at Christmas.

What to do?

- 1. Take a pencil and outline the shape you want to make on your Bible or prayer journaling page.
- 2. Gather washi tapes from your stash in coordinating colors.
- 3. Rip little bits of the washi tape and layer them in your shape!
- 4. You can "seal" it with gesso on the top if you want, but that is not necessary.



Favorite healthy drink recipe: matcha latte

Ingredients needed:

- Water
- Grass fed organic milk
- Organic matcha powder (Costco sells my favorite one!)
- Organic maple syrup

Supplies needed:


- · Your favorite mug
- Teaspoon
- Milk frother

Instructions:

- 1. Fill your mug with 4 oz of milk 8 heat.
- 1. Fill your other microwavable container with 4 oz of water.
- 2. Add 1 teaspoon matcha powder to the water.
- 1. Add maple syrup (or honey) to the water and matcha mixture. Add depending on how sweet you want your drink.
- 2. Heat water/matcha mixture.
- 3. Use frother to mix the water/matcha mixture.
- 4. Add to mug of milk, sip and enjoy!
